About the Track

The track was developed and owned by racers/private investors. The track is 2.47 miles long, 40 ft. wide with smooth concrete corner curbing. The front straight is ½ mile long. The 13–14–15 complex is tight and twisting, descending steeply downhill. There are plans for a dragstrip and even a hotel.

Getting There

I've confirmed it takes about 2 hours to get there from Seattle. MapQuest is accurate.

From I-5, take US 101 West from Olympia. Stay on US 101 north toward Shelton. Keep to the left lane where Hwy 3 cuts off. Turn left at US 102 and go a few miles and then turn right at Eells Hill Road. You will soon see the track on the right.


Hotels are available in Shelton and Olympia but reserve early if you want to stay at the casino.

The Track

Turn Numbering is Preliminary

Turns 1, 4, 5, 5b, 6, 7, 8b, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 16 It is my hope that we will have personnel to staff all these stations. Station locations may not be on the same side as shown. Light gray track is "future".

Turn 5b & 8b

The 5b station isn't shown on driver's right. 8b is still in planning/construction.

Special Stations

Turn 6

This station will call last car through during pace laps.

Turn 10

This will be the black flag station.

Turn 13

This station will call cars for black flag and the leader last lap (and perhaps cars entering the pits and/or paddock.)

Turn 16 (Pit in)

This station will call cars for black flag and the leader last lap as well as cars entering the pits and/or paddock.

Notes

Most stations will have parking available, assuming things dry out. The entire area is rocky dirt without any grass at this time.

Stations are elevated and covered. Bring your own seating.
